A political journey to the polling booth on Dec 12<sup>th</sup> chimes in well with our remembrance of the political journey Mary & Joseph had to make 2000 years ago in order to register in the Roman census in Joseph's hometown of Bethlehem. "A cold coming we had of it" writes TS Eliot in his poem about the coming of the Magi - another political journey, to visit the new King. Who will be our new leader come the morning of Dec 13th we wonder? We all have a responsibility to cast our hard-won human right to vote for the kind of vision we want for our country in the future. Some issues like Brexit and future trade deals will rumble on and on regardless of who gets in, but the question of what quality of life we want for our fellow citizens here and now is a far more pressing need. Pity the poor folk who will have to call at the local food bank for this year's Christmas dinner and the days following or sleep out unromantically under the stars because there was no room for them due to a shortage in social housing. # Notes from Last Meeting

**NEW COUNCILLOR.** There is a new Councillor in Swaton. Mrs Gina Parsons was welcomed by the Members and took her seat at the meeting.

**PLAY AREA UPDATE.** A grant of £10,000 from the Lottery will be used for a final piece of equipment. This will be a four-sided piece with platforms and a tower with a slide and walkways. A further £800 is needed for purchase, the Parish Council has £200 remaining in their fund. Various ideas for raising the remainder were discussed.

**COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH.** Two Speed Indication Devices have been ordered, to be positioned at each end of the village. The Parish Council and The Village Hut Committee are sharing the cost. Cllr Mrs Penketh is hoping to form a small group of parishioners for a Community Speedwatch group to operate a speed camera.

**NEWSLETTER.** Cllr Mrs Patrick has taken over as Editor of the village newsletter. After the December issue, they should be published bi-monthly. News will be included from the Parish Council, Hut Committee, Church and other village groups.

**BOOK EXCHANGE.** There may be a village book exchange in Swaton. A 'Little Free Library' scheme was agreed in principle. This will involve a small waterproof unit where people can take and leave books. Other places have used microwaves and old telephone boxes. A parishioner may make a wooden unit. Enquiries are being made as to location and permissions.

**DATE OF NEXT MEETING.** Tues. January 21st<sup>th</sup>, 7.45pm. Members of the public are welcome to come along to listen to the meeting, but may not generally speak during the meeting

**PUBLIC SESSION.** There is a public speaking session at 7.30pm. This is for anyone in the parish to come along and comment about items on the agenda which follows – so that Councillors can be aware of any public views when the agenda item is discussed. No actions or resolutions can be made from a public session. Any reports or comments about other matters should be reported to the Clerk or a Councillor at least a week before any meeting so, if necessary, the items can be placed on the agenda.

#### **Speed Signs and Community Speed Watch**

Over the years speeding has been a constant topic at Parish Council meetings so to help combat this issue, Swaton PC has now ordered 2 new Speed Indicator Displays which will be a permanent feature in the village by early 2020 but electronic devices aren't enough – like many other Parish Councils we need to be



more active. Swaton PC would like to set up a 'Community Speed Watch Programme'. This programme requires volunteers –groups of 3 people per session – one holding the speed gun, one spotting the offenders & one taking notes. The information can then be passed to the

police who will follow up with their due process. This won't be time consuming especially if there are a good number of volunteers – it is up to us how many sessions we hold and for how long. You could really make a difference to your village. Training event in Great Hale on 17 December.

### **Grass Verges**

To ensure the village looks its best, we need to protect and maintain the grass verges. Following the wet weather, the verges are very soft and easily damaged. Please avoid driving or parking on the verges and footpaths. Some damage is caused by lorries and large farm machinery (an essential part of our rural community) when unable to pass parked cars. Please avoid parking on the road, if possible, and if necessary, please consider other road users.

### **Nature Notes**

It has been a successful season for the House Martins this year but the Swallows disappointingly haven't done as well with few birds returning this summer to breed, this appears to be a country wide problem.

The early dark nights are upon us and all our summer birds have migrated only to be replaced by flocks of winter visitors. Look out for the Fieldfare and the Redwings, what a fantastic place we live in.

Leaving for work really early recently I could hear a skein of geese dropping into a flooded field next door. It was the weekend before I could actually see them but found they were not on their own, as lapwings were more numerous. Whilst the wet weather isn't so good for farming, it certainly has its advantages for local bird watching. The daily scanning of the bird feeders watching for the winter visitors bring many rewards brightening the dull days

The apples placed on the ground in the garden for the Fieldfare were quickly eaten up by our local rabbits, some of which became lunch for our resident stoat!

Our Barn owls have raised seven young in total this year in two clutches of three and a four. The second clutch admittedly were helped with a few morsels because the wet weather stopped the adult birds from flying. We excitedly watched as they took their first flight and now they are successfully hunting for themselves.

The Tawny and Little owls haven't bred in their boxes this year so I do not know how their breeding fared. We have been lucky to have had lots of views of both them on camera.

The hedgehogs which patrolled the garden all summer haven't been seen during the last two weeks. Hopefully they are now prepared for the winter, snuggled under the stick heaps provided for them.
