

### **REPORT FROM SWATON PARISH COUNCIL** 26th SEPTEMBER 2017

PRESENT: Cllrs A Deptford, (Chairman), A Dunlop, Mrs E Penketh, A Wilson, and the Clerk Mrs S McIntyre. Apologies for absence: C Richardson

Play Area: Swaton's play park now has a new youth shelter and further equipment has been made possible due to grants. There was a discussion about a goal post area with fixed surround including a basketball hoop. Fencing behind the goal post may be needed. Enquiries will continue and results will go to the Play Park committee.

**Speed Indicator Signs:** The parish council found that providing two fixed speed indicator signs would cost between £6,000 and £14,000 for supply and fitting. This may be too expensive for the parish council to consider at this time. Some stick on 30mph signs for wheelie bins are being looked at to give through traffic an awareness of the speed limit.

Finance: Swaton's 2016/17 audit has been signed off and the relevant notices and documents are on the web site at swaton.org.uk

**Planning:** A plan to erect a new dwelling with detached garage off Parson's Grove has been approved by the District Council. The Parish Council had no comments about plans for the Viking Link Interconnector Project – which will bring power from off shore wind farms to the Bicker sub-station. Councillors did comments about the amount of papers and documents received – two large boxes full which was sent out to all the consultees.

### PARISH COUNCILLOR VACANCY. HELP MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO YOUR VILLAGE

Due to the resignation of Councillor Dunlop, the Parish Council has a vacant chair to be filled. If you would like to stand as a candidate, there are certain qualifications that must be met: You must be 18 years old or over on the day you submit your nomination and either a UK or Commonwealth citizen, citizen of the Irish Republic or member state of the EU. In addition, you must also have lived, worked or been registered in the district or parish for the whole of the previous 12 months.

You're not allowed to stand as a candidate if: you already work for the parish council, are subject to bankruptcy restrictions, have within the last five years been sentenced to a prison term of three months or more.

The Council only meets once every two months, but you will be expected to be involved between meetings - mainly by email.
