This event will recognise and commemorate the 15th Anniversary of the end of Op Telic, and the 35th anniversary of the end of the Gulf War as well as the 90th Anniversary of Bomber Command and the awarding of Veteran Badges. E-Waste Action Week returns bigger and better

Building on last year's success, [E-Waste Action Week](#) is coming back with an expanded programme. With two Repair Cafes in the week (in Sleaford and Bracebridge Heath) and drop-off points around the District, we're hoping it'll have an even bigger impact.

Electronic waste - E-Waste - consists of all those electrical and electronic items which we discard, including cables, which millions of us stash in drawers and cupboards. These devices are packed with useful materials that could be reused, saving the environmental damage caused by mining.

Sleaford Climate Action Network (SleafordCAN) and North Kesteven District Council are working together to run the Action Week from 16 to 23 May 2026. North Kesteven residents are encouraged to donate mobile phones, laptops, tablets and cables during the event, which will be refurbished and redistributed to people in need, or recycled securely.

At the event in 2025, which was focused on Sleaford, 84 laptops, more than 380 phones and tablets, and 220kg of cables were donated. Everything was data wiped and reset to protect the original user's information. Older devices such as those on 3G signals or where operating systems could not be updated, were sent to Ghana and Ukraine. Any remaining items were securely destroyed and the materials recycled. All the items that could be refurbished are distributed to local people and good causes.



Food waste recycling - successful first month

One month after launching food waste collections in Lincoln, North Kesteven and West Lindsey, and two weeks into South Kesteven's rollout, early results show a positive response from residents. Thousands of households are now using their food waste caddies each week, helping to recycle food that would previously have gone in the general waste stream. In the first month alone, more than 950 tonnes of food waste has been collected across the four districts.

The new service makes it easier for residents to recycle everyday items such as peelings, leftovers, tea bags and bones. All of the food waste that is collected from homes is taken to an anaerobic digestion facility, where it is turned into energy and fertiliser, supporting local agriculture and generating renewable power

Some key reminders for caddy-users:

- The collection is weekly so you can put your caddy out every week on your usual black, green-lidded or purple-lidded bin day – no matter how much or how little you have inside it.
- You can use any other plastic liners such as bread bags or shopping bags – they get separated at the plant.
- Your food waste caddy is collected by a different team in different vehicles, so will typically be picked up earlier or later than your wheeled bins.
- Only your orange-lidded caddy should be placed out for collection, please don't place your grey caddy inside your orange-lidded caddy.

It is made in response to the Department for Culture, Media and Sport's Town of Culture competition which comes with has a top prize of £3m to deliver cultural programmes in 2028, and two further packages of £250,000.

Crisis and Resilience Fund
