YOUR HELP IS NEEDED - QUEEN ELIZABETH PARK

Swaton's Recreation Park is being built bit-by-bit with donations and grant money. Grants are competitively fought for, hard to obtain, complex and time consuming to complete and disappointing when we don't win one - we've been lucky with some and not so lucky with others. Once an application has been submitted it's often a matter of a board of directors or a panel agreeing that the applicant is a worthy contender, but sometimes it's down to a voting

system. Swaton PC has applied to the CO-OP's Community Green Space Grant and has been shortlisted to the final 3, but unlike the Tesco grant where the final 3 all received a varying amount of money, the COOP grant has only one winner . . . and to win **WE NEED EVERYONE'S HELP** including the kids . . .

The next stage is an 'Environment Forum' and the winner will be chosen by people attending the meeting – this is the <u>ONLY</u> way we will get this money hence needing <u>your</u> help. We lost out on AVIVA's £25k (which would have completed the park) due to being out-voted – it is vital that we don't lose out on this money as grant opportunities are becoming less and less.

The forum is an open & free meeting for everyone to attend. The 3 projects will be presented then a vote will be taken by a show of hands – if you're not there we won't stand a chance.

Refreshments will be served & tickets are free.


