QUEEN ELIZABETH RECREATION PARK

One of the grants that has been applied for is the **AVIVA COMMUNITY FUND**. The only way to be awarded the AVIVA grant is to be one of the top voted projects in a section. Some projects are only asking for £1000, others are in the £5k - £10k category. Swaton has entered in to the highest group at £10k - £25k so we need everyone to help by registering on the AVIVA

website and voting for our project. There are only a limited number of projects who'll win the maximum award so PLEASE HELP YOUR VILLAGE. You can register using as many email addresses that you have - use work and personal email addresses and maximise our chances. Ask your friends, family and colleagues to help too.

To register use the link above, enter in your email address and name. A link will be sent to your in-box, click on the emailed link and you'll be returned to the AVIVA page. Tick the relevant box (which asks if you're an Aviva customer and age range), type Swaton or Lincolnshire in the location box and click on Queen Elizabeth Recreation Park, then simply add 10 votes to our project - it really is very easy and takes no more than a few minutes.

This money will help towards the purchase of a variety of equipment including a wheelchair friendly roundabout (that's £8,300 on its own), adaptive swings (disabled-friendly chair style with straps) & baby / toddler park equipment as well as the much-requested shelter. Every vote & every penny counts.

Voting opened Friday $21^{\rm st}$ October & closes in a few weeks so there is only a small window in which to vote - please find 2 minutes to register and vote.


CINEMA CLUB - 1st Saturday in February to November

CRAFT GROUP - EVERY TUESDAY FROM 9.30AM



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Swaton is lucky to have an active L.I.V.E.S group manned by a few volunteers who use some of their free time to support the ambulance service, typically dealing with medical emergencies within a 6 mile radius of Swaton when an ambulance is too far to respond quickly.

A L.I.V.E.S responder carries oxygen & a defibrillator and attends incidences such as breathing difficulties, cardiac arrest, falls etc. Full training is given and it's a very worthwhile activity.

Alan Wilson would like to extend a massive thank you to Andrew Deptford, Mick Holmes, Peter Penketh and Andy Dunlop (who came all the way from his new home in Yorkshire). They all responded to Alan's request for help in the park on Sunday 9th October.

It's not easy to see (unless you look closely at the ground) but everyone worked very hard in digging out the areas around the pedestrian and vehicular entrances to lay 'Bodpave' in order to protect the ground and tree roots. Despite the lack on the day of volunteers, the task was competed before the rain set it. The ground had to be dug out, membrane and hardcore was laid under the Bodpave and then it was backfilled using the removed soil which will allow the grass to regrow over it.

This work had to be done to adhere to planning permission BodPaving is a recycled, safe & sustainable eco-friendly product made up of interlocking cellular paving grids for grass and ground reinforcement, usually seen where there is regular pedestrian or vehicle use such as car parks and play grounds.



SPEED SIGNS

You may have noticed that the SIDs don't seem to stay on that long, that's due to the internal batteries being past their sell-by-date (not that many drivers respect our village speed limit). To remedy this problem, the Parish Council have ordered new batteries and shared the cost with the other Parish Councils who share the use of the SIDs. The new batteries aren't in stock yet but in the meantime we will persevere with what we have !

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
